



OPTOMETRY BULLETIN March 30th, 2021

Important Information on Interim Non-Face-to-Face Services Provided During Pandemic.

Eligible dates of service have been extended to March 31st, 2022

Optometrists may claim for the following services when they are provided non-face-to-face (via telephone or *Personal Health Information Act* [PHIA] compliant virtual care platform):

- 03.03 CNTC
- 03.03 CCDX

Please submit your claims for encounters as you normally would, using your normal practice location. For all services not rendered face-to-face at that location, **include the following text on the claim to denote the mode of synchronous care delivery**:

- If the service was provided via phone call: Pandemic telephone
- If the service was provided over a PHIA-compliant virtual care platform: Pandemic virtual care

These will be paid at the current tariff remuneration rates, consistent with current frequency limits. Eligible dates are March 25th, 2020 to March 31st, 2022.

Provincial Virtual Care Policy Now Available

DHW has released a policy on the *Provision of Publicly Funded Virtual Health Services*, which is available from the Nova Scotia Association of Optometrists. The policy applies to all publicly funded health services including optometry professional services.
